# **Chapter 1**

# Crafting a brand identity

In this chapter, you are going to learn about how impactful becoming a brand can help you stand out and become visible to people in your industry.

If there is something you need as a starter in business for good visibility and to become credible to your target audience early enough in your journey of business, it is to BUILD YOUR SELF AS A BRAND...

A brand identity is the Foundation of any successful business.

This means you need to know what a brand means so you can replicate that in your business. A brand is a person's feeling towards the product or services you render or of an organization.

Brand comprises The Voice (tone of communication or communication pattern) behavior, beliefs, values, customers experience concerned about the product or service you render either as an individual or as an organization.

Going through the meaning I have given you, you see that a brand has nothing to do with what you say it is but what your consumers say it is.

Branding is the impression management in the value you've added to the heart of your customers.

When we tend to create a brand we need to understand clearly what we need our customers to think of our services or products.

In a region where competition is fierce, you as a business person need to turn your business to a brand so you can differentiate what your business stands for, from others and this way your customers can easily know what you represent.

Brand identity gives you the best way to boost your business visibility and credibility. You may have heard people say create a brand, create a brand- but then in your mind what does it mean to create this brand?

Does it mean creating a logo (as most people think it is) or building a big social media audience? Or creating wonderful shops or supermarkets and so on etc.

This are thoughts an average business person has but it goes beyond all these. Crafting a strong brand identity goes beyond just creating a catchy logo or having a huge following on social media platforms.

It involves a deep understanding of your target audience and what sets your business apart (the value that makes your business unique) and can't be compared to your competitors.

Example of brands you may know in Nigeria and beyond are MTN, GLO, DANGOTE, COCA-COLA, BUA GROUP, NESTLE, MULTICHOICE, UNILEVER, TRANSSION, CHIVITA, PZ CUSSONS, etc.

Let's take a brief study on these brands so you understand how brand identity can build your business visibility and credibility.

The brands I listed above have created an impression that in Nigeria, these brands don't need to start explaining what they do to you before you buy their product or their services.

This is because they have created a value scheme that makes you identify each of them easily just by seeing their names. In most cases you don't need to see their names but once you think of them you know what they do.

Take for instance when you hear of Glo, you know they offer telecommunication service, when you hear of Tecno, you know they offer electronics, when you hear of BUA group you know they offer cement etc.

The question now is, Do you need your business to grow big just like these business brands have grown over the ages before you become visible or credible to your target audience?

Well the answer is NO!

You only need to understand what these brands have done that you can imitate, what have these brands done that you can improve on and what possible things you can do to stay relevant for the future of the brand you want to create.

The level you are in your business is enough for you to create your brand.

Besides, crafting your brand identity helps your business thrive and get more visibility, more credibility and more customers' trust.

Having known what a brand is all about, now how do you create a brand for your business?

# 5 unique guides to help you create your own brand

1. Understand the target audience for your business: Who do you want to serve in your business?

The truth of it is that you can't serve everyone - your ability to say in a sentence specifically who you want to serve, is your target audience.

For instance I am a marketer, and I help small business owners by recommending marketing strategies to 10x their profit. You can see that's my audience right there and you can create an audience just by doing this based on your own business too.

2. What value are you serving your audience? The value you create in the hearts of your audience determines your brand.

You need to have this unique value that only you can serve your customers. This value may be in the pricing of your offers, structure of your services and may also be in the design of your product or service etc.

It may also be in the tone of voice- that is the communication pattern with your customers, your behavior towards them or maybe anything you can anchor on that makes your business not replaceable in the hands of people.

For instance, Coca-Cola has built a brand that makes you visualize the taste of their drink before you take it.

You can apply these for your business in your own capacity by making your business a go-to that people want even before getting into business with you.

## 3. Monitor customer experience:

To stand as a brand, you need to know that your customers must not be neglected. Their experiences shape what your business becomes.

Think of It this way: if Pepsi tastes differently each time you buy it and after you complain to the company and nothing is done about that, will you continue to buy?

That same way it is in your business. If customers complain and their experience with your business is not consistent, then you'll be failing to build a brand.

Brand identity makes it easy for brand marketing and brand marketing helps you measure your success rate.

Brand marketing can't be measured, that means your business will get the visibility it needs timelessly. People on their own will recommend your business even without your knowledge and some will vouch for your product quality or service.

# **Chapter 2**

# **Business Positioning**

Positioning is the stigma you place on your product to show how and why your product is the best at delivering the value that a lot of your customers care about, relative to your competitors.

Let's take a good example to understand what positioning is all about. When I pitch about what I do to people, I go by saying- I run a digital marketing brand which works with small business owners by recommending marketing strategies to 10x their profit.

Now this is how I position my marketing brand. The idea for me is to specifically place my brand in the minds of people who are business owners.

I'm not intending or wanting to work with all businesses. No. Rather, I streamlined my brand and focus only to work for small business owners.

You just need to learn how to position your business so it becomes different from your competitors.

Why positioning is important

#### A. Focus:

It keeps your business focus thereby helping you build a better visibility.

If your mind is specific on what you do as a business and nothing more is taking your attention, you will be more committed to it.

Focus gives you more avenues to table down on what you want for your business.

And focus starts from you positioning your business the right way in the market.

## B. Easy to dominate the market.

Positioning your business as the solution to the pain points of your target audience, with time can easily make you dominate the market.

Look at when Pepsi came into the market knowing cola already dominated the market, they rather positioned their brand as uncola which means if you don't like the taste of cola, you can then try uncola -which is Pepsi.

They easily dominated this market of people who wanted to taste another drink other than cola.

# How to position your brand for visibility and credibility.

## 1. Have a point of view on the market.

You need to have a say in the market if you want to push your business visibility.

Having a say is having your own thoughts on why your business should serve the market the way you present it and not just serve, but serve better to the market in such a sense.

2. Pick a fight with an existing brand. You will need to pick a fight by being the opposite of what they're known for.

Just like the case of Coca-Cola and Pepsi, the case of peak milk and three crowns.

Picking a fight does not entail you entering the market to attack. You position your market as opposite of what such brand(s) are already serving in the market.

To have a better understanding of how to do this, this is an exercise you need to practice.

A . Go to any store of your choice, look at the categories of any Brand and compare how these brands position each of the products against their counterparts.

Take note of the write ups,the colour,the problem their product is trying to solve,the product container shape and more you can find on these products.

B . Now think about your competitors and relate this to the competitor in your business and try to replicate what you see from the store between any two seminar brands you checked out in the store.

## 3. Know your target market.

Starting my journey as a marketer after completing digital courses and taking training, I kept having this question in my mind, what is this target audience really all about.

Until I had to come up with a way to describe the target audience as a single person who I want to serve with a specific solution, and if I can serve this person, that means I can serve more people similar to this person.

This is also what you need to know about in other to find your target audience.

Who are they? Are they like people who don't like the taste of cola and want uncola?

This question will prompt you to find and know Who your target audience are and What your target audience does.

Know what they normally do and also know what you do.

Know why they do what they do.

This will help you understand how to position your business to serve them and bring the visibility you demand.

I was referred to a fashion business owner who needed the services of a digital marketer, and while I asked her the target audience she wants to serve, she said that she wants to serve only chubby ladies who find it difficult to get clothes in the market.

This means chubby ladies are her target audience and knowing about this makes it much easier for us to work together, position her business the right way and get the required outcome she desires.

I'm citing this example here to help you understand that you can't serve everyone and the faster you discover your target audience, the easier it becomes for you to sell.

Still finding it difficult to position your business, you can relate it to me in the group you were added to automatically when you downloaded this book.

# **Chapter 3**

# **Leveraging Digital Channels**

Chapter 1 on chapter 2 is a guide on how to do the internal aspect required for your business to build good visibility and credibility before you can start the outward process of getting more business visibility and credibility.

This chapter is centered to teach you on how you can leverage digital marketing channels to get the results you require.

I will dive deeper to show you how each of these platforms can help you step by step get the desired result you want for your business.

With the rise of digital technology, leveraging digital marketing channels such as Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and Tiktok can help you increase your business visibility.

Social media platforms on its own have become indispensable tools used by a lot of businesses looking to increase their business visibility and reach.

Without knowing the right methods or approach, you may fail at doing this.

#### PART 1

#### SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS

Before we dive deep to learn how to use this platforms, you need to take note that

- •You need to identify which platforms are most popular among your target audience (that is people who you want to be your consistent customers).
- •You need to agree to start with at least two channels and nothing more than that unless you hire an agency or you have a team that can help you handle more than two channels at the same time.

Now the question becomes what platforms are your target audience hanging out on?

First let's talk about how to identify the two platforms for any business niche you fall into before moving to others.

Well let me clarify this by giving you the statistics of each platform users on a monthly basis.

Statistically, there are over 3 billion people who use Facebook, 1.4 billion people worldwide who use Instagram, 500.7 million using X(formerly twitter) and 900.7 million on Tiktok today.

But when it comes specifically to the Nigerian market the percentage of social media platforms are WhatsApp 94.9% Facebook it's 8.8% Instagram \$69.4% Twitter 61.2% and tiktok 57.4% Snapchat 52.6%.

This data is meant to give you an idea of the social media space your target audience hangs out the most. Looking at the stats, this social media platform represents where you should push your brand more to get the visibility you want from the clients.

This means your business needs to be on Facebook, Instagram or tiktok as a start-up.

Based on the principle I have given above of picking two platforms to start with, then you need to consider what these platforms are mostly known for and the type of contents that are mostly pushed out and consumed by users more there.

Facebook is for videos and more written posts.

WhatsApp is mostly for people who are close since the need to have your business number.

Which means for WhatsApp, you are in for people who have your contact and are likely to view your status updates and more.

Instagram is more of images and infographics.

Twitter is more of short form content and videos, mostly trending contents.

Tiktok is more of videos, infographics and no write ups.

You need to consider what you can easily do, since you're starting with two platforms, ask yourself this questions before you choose the platforms:

Can I write about my brand easily?

If you answer YES to this question, then that means you can consider starting with Facebook and twitter.

Can I make videos even with my phone easily?

Then you may consider Tiktok, Instagram, Facebook as good options.

I am generalising this to be the most apt option you must choose, but this will give you an idea on considering the right channels you need to start with.

Knowing what platforms you can easily use helps you understand how to start out in creating and pushing out your contents.

Just like I said, you start with two and progress to more. Once you've identified the right social media platforms for your business the next step is to create compelling content that resonates with your potential audience, and can bring about change (value) to their lives if they should use your brand product or services.

In addition, as you are pushing this content using your social media pages or accounts, you can also benefit from investing in social media advertising to help your business get more eyeballs from people on what you do.

Platforms like Google, Facebook and Instagram offer you advertising tools that allow your business brand to target specific demographics, interests and behaviors.

By strategically targeting this audience that is for your business, you make your business become more visible to people on the social media space.

You can target this audience using ads, but if you don't know how to target this audience to get good results don't panic all you have to do is to reach out to me, in the group you're added after downloading this book or go on to https://:martinvic.com.ng/branding

This way you make your business get more visible eyes on what you do and so they patronize you.

Also this way you can be able to grow your pages making your target audience follow you and be aware of the products or services you offer on a regular basis.

## My advert principle.

Now if you want to run ads, or must run adverts to keep getting the visibility you really demand for your business, I have this advert principle that works and it's a fit for most businesses.

This advert principle is called CAP (Consistent advert principle). It entails setting out a consistent advert budget that you can use to push your business to an audience you are already sure of.

Using this principle requires that you are now aware of the audience to target, that is let's say you are now aware of people interested in mens shoes in your audience of fashion business, then you apply this omniscient principle which I am still going to show you more details about in the promotion principles section.

In a nutshell,the principle is all about targeting that specific audience you're sure that have shown interest to buy from you, you target continuously until the buy.

Nevertheless, if you're not sure of the audience, all you need to do is run a cold advert to target broadly until you get to know your specific audience.

Back to the principle.

You need a consistent budget that can keep your advert running every day. For Facebook and Instagram, you need a minimum of #3000 to #5000 naira (\$3-\$5) per day as advert spend to get the desired visibility you want and this should go on for not just a month but for months.

You need to also know that the more visibility you get, that's the more the boost to what you sell and that can be converted to more money you make, since you'll be making sales from the audience coming into your space.

## Using Facebook to Build Business Visibility and Credibility

Facebook remains one of the largest social platforms, offering both organic reach and paid advertising opportunities to elevate your brand.

The key to building visibility and credibility lies in using the platform strategically:

## 1. First Optimize Your Business Page

SEO refers to you being able to understand how search engines work and being able to optimize your business so these search engines can know what your business is all about and show it to people who need your business products or your services.

Think of this.

If you want to buy an item and you want to get to know the experience of others who have used the item, what do you do?

I guess you will normally first Google the item to get more information about the item. Now while googling for this item, it's only people who understand that their business needs to be on search engines, you will see the items on their websites.

Here are things you need to know when it comes to SEO

• Search Engine includes Google, Bing, Yahoo, Yellow pages and more.

- SEO requires your business must have a website.
- SEO requires you have a nice website that loads faster and other things will be discussed later.

To be able to take advantage of SEO and give your business a consistent visibility that you wouldn't need to pay for, the process you must follow is an easy and interesting one but some times not easy to apply without the right approach.

1. Get an easy to navigate and fast loading website. Your business loading time should be within 1-3 seconds. This loading time frame is needed for your business website due to reasons that human beings attention span can be captured within 3sec period.

No one likes to waste or wait long time before they see the product or service they are hoping to purchase, that's why you need to have a fast loading website.

2 . Submit your website to this search engines. Google,Bing and other searching engines requires you to know that you have a business that needs visitors.

Submitting your website to this search engine through the medium called webmasters tools (that is searching consoles), search engines become aware that such websites exist and send their website crawler bots out to crawl your website and so they can get information on what product or service your website offers.

Knowing this helps this search engines know what to show your website visitors based on the person's query (i.e search) on searching this platform like Google.

3. Understanding that search engines need to know what your website is all about, this means you need to know how to optimize your website so search engines get to understand it clearly.

To optimize your website you will need to understand the concept of what we call homepage and off page SEO.

On page SEO are those automatizations you do on the website to help search engines discover or know what a website is all about.

**Off page SEO** are those optimizations you do out of your website for search engines to understand that your website serves based on a particular category of business.

Still about On page SEO as this is primarily what you need to do. On page SEO involves optimizing your website based on keywords, having good contents, having good small size images, meta descriptions etc.

-. Keywords here means what people cue into search engine and expect an information based on what the search for.

Example 1: how to boost my business visibility.

Example 2: local restaurants near me

Example 3: best laptops for online business etc.

All these can be regarded as keywords if that's what people search to know about on these search engines.

Knowing about these keywords and optimizing your website to carry information about this keywords helps your website become recommended by these search engines, that is if your website posts answer the query of the searcher.

For instance if you're selling foods and you optimize your website to keywords like local restaurants in ikorodu to represent your business, which is selling food in ikorodu (Lagos) when someone in ikorodu searches for keyword like local restaurant near me, this your business website possess a good chance of appearing on search results of the person because the keyword your website is optimizing for is also what the person searched for on Google.

You can optimize your keywords by writing good and high quality contents (articles or videos) providing information in details about the keyword.

Another example is if you sell laptops and you get information from these search engines that people search for the best laptops for gaming and you're someone who sells laptops.

Having more knowledge about this, you write on the keyword "best laptops for gaming" your business is likely to get sales every month in or out of the season because your websites will be shown to people regularly.

This is a great visibility choice every brand or business that wants to do great goes in for because the monthly search of this keyword your website is optimized for can be massive, that means a higher monthly chance of getting consistent sales and more visibility of your business to the people out there.

You may ask what number of monthly traffic (website visitors) can I get from this?

Well based on the keyword and the business you do you can get as much as 1k to 100k searches and beyond.

Imagine having 1k people coming to your website and knowing about products or services you render, if 10% of this people makes purchase of what you sell every month you know what that means for your business.

SEO is a paramount step every good brand or business must pursue to attract customers to their local area of business.
